5. Conflict	_____	E. A symbolic narrative in which the story represents a deeper meaning. (Ex: <i>The Lion, the Witch, and the Wardrobe</i>)
6. Flat Character	_____	F. The time, place, and context in which a story is established
7. Foil	_____	G. A literary reference to a well-known person, place, thing, or other literary work that the general public will understand without explanation
