Using the Google Chrome internet browser, navigate to <https://www.google.com/earth/> and click “Launch Earth”. If you have your parents’ permission, you may also be able to download the Google Earth app onto your computer or device.

The goal is to explore this application with fresh and curious eyes. One starting point to enter in a place to want to see using the search bar. For example, you can type “Pyramids in Egypt” or “Eiffel Tower in Paris, France”, and after Google clarifies what you’re asking for, you can jump straight to a view of the Pyramids or Eiffel Tower from overhead. Click on 3D for a better view. You can also drag and drop the little person icon onto the map for an even better view!

Another option is to click on the Voyager icon, which looks like a ship’s wheel. This offers an array of interesting topics to choose from if you can’t think of anything on your own. You can peruse national parks, big cities, or places you may never visit in your lifetime, such as Ostrov Shikotan, a volcanic island at the northern tip of Japan, near Russia.
