

## How to Cite Quotes in a Paper

### Example of how to cite exact text from the book:

In the Exposition of *Stay Where You Are and Then Leave*, readers learn that Alfie Summerfield was five years old when his father, Georgie, went off to war, and it would be another four years of no contact between the soldier and his family. In that time, Alfie's relationship with his mother suffered because he asked a lot of questions and she gave no answers. Margie was exhausted: "Her voice was unforgiving; one thing that Alfie noticed about the way his mother had changed over the last four years was how harsh she'd become" (Boyne 37).

### Example of how to cite a partially cited scene from the book:

In the Exposition of *Stay Where You Are and Then Leave*, readers learn that Alfie Summerfield was five years old when his father, Georgie, went off to war, and it would be another four years of no contact between the soldier and his family. In that time, Alfie's relationship with his mother suffered because he asked a lot of questions and she gave no answers. Margie was exhausted from working, worrying, and wondering when the war might end, so much that Alfie realized, "the way his mother had changed" and "how harsh she'd become" (Boyne 37).
